

TONE-ON-TONE EMBROIDERY DYEING AFTER EMBROIDERING

Do you wish the embroidery to have the exact same color as the fabric? You dye your garment after embroidering?

No problem! For this you need to embroider with raw thread on your raw fabric and then dye.

What you should consider:

Fabric and embroidery thread must be of the same material or must be dyed with the same dyes.

The following list will help you decide which thread to use for what fabric.

Fabric	Embroidery Thread
Mercerized cotton	COTTY or SULKY
Non mercerized cotton	COTTY or SULKY (Note: here the embroidery is somewhat darker than the fabric)
Polyester/Cotton	COTTY or POLY
Polyester	POLY

For tone-on-on tone embroidery you must always order raw thread. Neither white nor dyed threads are suitable for this purpose.

In the case of **viscose thread (SULKY)** this is simple. Color number 1071 in the SULKY color chart is an undyed raw thread. This color is available from stock on 1,000m Miniking cones or on 5,000m cones.

Cotton thread (COTTY) and polyester thread (POLY) are available in different thicknesses (COTTY 30/12 and POLY 60/40) as raw thread on sample spools with approx. 1,000 m for first tests free of charge. Following your successful tests, we will be able to offer you make-ups, delivery times and pricing depending on the quantity you wish to order.

IMPORTANT:

You must perform tests in any case. Fabrics, threads and dyes may dye differently and may also result in different fastnesses.
